George Balanchine's *Ballet Imperial*, like his *Theme and Variations*, evokes the era of czarist Russia's Imperial Ballet with its grandeur and elegance.

A classical ballet in three movements, *Ballet Imperial*, with scenery and costumes by Mstislav Doboujinsky, received its World Premiere by American Ballet Caravan at the Hunter College Playhouse, New York on May 27, 1941, danced by Marie-Jeanne, Gisella Caccialanza, and William Dollar. It entered the repertory of New York City Ballet, with scenery and costumes by Rouben Ter-Arutunian, in 1964, danced by Suzanne Farrell, Patricia Neary, and Jacques d'Amboise.

Ballet Imperial was restaged by New York City Ballet under the title Piano Concerto No. 2 and received its first performance with that name on January 12, 1973, danced by Patricia McBride, Colleen Neary, and Peter Martins.

Ballet Imperial received its American Ballet Theatre Company Premiere on February 10, 1988 at the Auditorium Theatre, Chicago, Illinois, danced by Susan Jaffe, Ross Stretton, and Amanda McKerrow.
